

The Town of Vauxhall is a place for everyone. It is well situated between the Bow River and Oldman River along Highway #36 in southern Alberta. The town is in a thriving agricultural area, with abundant water for irrigation and progressive, innovative farming operations. Oil resources are abundant with the resulting economic benefits to the area including entrepreneurial opportunities and stable jobs.

The best kept secret about Vauxhall is the Vauxhall Academy of Baseball operated in partnership with the Vauxhall High School. The accomplishments of this partnership include successfully graduating 97 academy athletes over the past 8 years of which 15 have been Major League Baseball (MLB) draft picks and 33 Canadian Junior National Team Invitees.



Recent Investments and Projects

Vauxhall has had several recent investments made to its public works infrastructure and recreational assets

Project	Description
Pool	\$877,500 built a new pool with slides and play areas, completed in 2016.
New Library	\$450,000 invested in a new library that will include meeting space.
High School	Vauxhall High School underwent an \$18 million dollar renovation completed in August 2012.
Other Schools	In 2009, a \$900,000 renovation was completed at the elementary school, and in 2012, \$300,000 was invested in updating the Mennonite Alternative Program School.
Vauxhall Academy of Baseball Water Treatment Plant	\$1.2 million multi-purpose facility opened in 2011. Includes dorm rooms, residence manager house, laundry, players' lounge, weight room, cardio room, locker-room, therapy room, and offices. A \$17 million, 6 million liter/ day (MLD) water treatment facility was completed in 2012. Owned by the Vauxhall and District Regional Water Services Commission.
Street Work	\$1.3 Million 5th Street pavement and infrastructure replacement.
Commercial Land Development	The MD of Taber is developing commercial land on the east side of Highway 36.



Vauxhall is on the Highway 36 north-south highway corridor which connects to the CANAMEX Trade Corridor south of Lethbridge. The Corridor includes approximately 1,150 km of Alberta's provincial highway network, including parts of Highways 4, 3, 2, 216, 16, and 43, linking the Alberta/ Montana border crossing to the Alberta - British Columbia border on Highway 43.

Emergency services in Vauxhall are provided by a local volunteer fire brigade and an RCMP detachment. The closest hospital is in Taber (only 37 kilometres). Ambulance is provided by Alberta Health Services. Trained staff include 6 Emergency Medical Technicians (EMT) and 10 Emergency Medical Responders (EMR).


